This funding will be used to

- Implement strategies that support staff and students to achieve 70% of students in Prep to Year 6 achieve a 'C' and above in English.
- Implement strategies that support 43% of students identified through NCCD achieving C or above in English.
- Implement strategies that support staff and students to reach the National Minimum Standards (NMS) in Year 3 and Year 5 Reading for 90% of students
- Implement strategies that support staff and students to achieve 85% of students in Prep to Year 6 to meet or exceed Fountas and Pinnell year level benchmark
- Implement strategies and provide resources to increase students' participation and engagement in learning.

Our initiatives include

- Build staff capability through targeted and responsive professional learning in developing knowledge and understanding of the P – 10 Australian Curriculum in curriculum design, pedagogy, assessment and feedback.
- Providing focused and intensive intervention and support based on student achievement data, student support plans and student needs.
- Provision of resources and initiatives to support curriculum implementation, intervention and student participation and engagement in learning.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Strategic Planning for teams of teachers and teacher aides to build capacity through active participation in Professional Learning Teams using a collaborative inquiry model, engaging in quality Professional Development, coaching/peer mentoring, feedback initiatives to build staff capacity and Collegial Engagement initiatives including WOW (Watching Others work) and Learning Walks and Talks and Professional Learning.
